The structure of the book of Exodus

- Chapters 1-18 <u>deliverance</u> (salvation)
- Chapters 19-25 covenant (righteousness)
- Chapters 26-40 <u>tabernacle</u> (worship)

What is the tabernacle?

- 1. It's a tent; temporary and man-made.
- 2. It's the place where God <u>dwells</u> with His people.
- 3. It's the place where the **atonement sacrifice** was made.

The tabernacle as a type of Christ

- What do we mean by "type"?
 - Typology in Christian theology and <u>biblical</u> exegesis is a doctrine or theory concerning the relationship of the Old Testament to the New Testament. (Wikipedia)
 - We can define a type as a "prophetic symbol" because all types are representations of something yet future.
 - More specifically, a type in scripture is a person or thing in the Old Testament which <u>foreshadows</u> a person or thing in the New Testament.
 - The presence of God the incarnation; Immanuel, God with us.
 - > Elements
 - The altar, the lampstand, the wash basins.

- Access to God there was only one <u>entrance</u>; Jesus is the only way to God.
 - John 14.6; Matthew 27.51
- > Portable God goes with us --
 - where ever we go, Jesus is right there with us
