The Covenant Confirmed Exodus 24.1-11

July 8, 2018

Introduction:

One of the most significant questions we can ask is: how can I be <u>certain</u> that I'm saved; how can I know that I'm going to heaven?

The answer to that question finds its <u>foundation</u> in this passage...

Main Points:

1. God calls us into his presence

God calls up Moses, the priests, and the elders. Foreshadowing the pattern of the <u>Tabernacle</u>, only one person can enter the most holy place. The major 'take away' here is that God has called these people to himself.

We have received invitations to a great banquet -

Zephaniah 1.7

Luke 14.15-24

2. God covers us with the blood of Christ

The invitation was an invitation to worship; it was also an invitation to be reconciled to God through an atonement sacrifice (the burnt offering) and a fellowship offering. The blood is necessary for the atonement.

For the people to receive <u>life</u> something must <u>die</u> in their place.

Leviticus 17.11 --

Hebrews 9.22 -

The anxiety we might feel over whether we will go to heaven disappears when we begin o realize that it is not our <u>merit</u> that earns us a place in the mansions of glory, but the <u>efficacy</u> of the shed blood of Christ.

3. God <u>communes</u> with us at the table

The ultimate end to the covenant ratification process is a <u>meal</u>. This brings the matter of the Last Supper into sharper focus. Although Jesus did eat with the disciples after the resurrection, the <u>Passover</u> meal was eaten before the death of Christ out of practical necessity.

We can sleep well knowing that God has called us to himself, covered us in his blood and has <u>reserved</u> a place for us at his table.
