- 1. A Sense of _
 - John is depicted as a prophet. Frequent reference is made in the OT to prophets being sent by God
 - b. 2 Chr. 24:19; 25:15; Jer. 7:25; 25:4, 5; 28:9; 35:15; 44:4
 - c. The Jewish crowds regarded John as a prophet (Matt. 21:26/Mark 11:32/Luke 20:6), and that is how Jesus also described him (Matt. 11:9/Luke 7:26).
 - d. John is the subject of Isaiah 40.3: A voice cries: In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. c.f. John 1.23; Luke 3.4; Mark 1.3; Matthew 3.3
