A Roadmap Through the Wilderness

Hebrews 3.7-19

Introduction

- The people of God are in <u>crisis</u> and are abandoning their faith
- This passage and the 6 verses that precede it are about <u>faithfulness</u>
- Faithfulness is tied to <u>obedience</u> and <u>trust</u>; it's a heart issue
- The term "heart" is used <u>three</u> times in this passage
 - o What is the "heart"?
- How can we maintain a vibrant faith?

Main Points: We can maintain a vibrant faith by . . .

- 1. cultivating realistic expectations
 - o the Israelites hardened their hearts
 - stubborn and obstinate
 - disappointment, frustration, <u>unmet</u> expectations
 - o what is God concerned about?
 - Holiness over happiness; trust and obedience; faith
 - What do you <u>expect</u> from God and/or the church?

2. avoid unnecessary temptation

- o their hearts had gone astray
 - human responsibility / sin is volitional / the devil didn't make you do it
 - James 1.12-13
- o thou shall not covet
 - 1Timothy 6.6 "But godliness with contentment(!) is great gain"
- Stay <u>focused</u> on Jesus and you won't wander off the path

3. Pursue godly education

- o They had sinful, unbelieving hearts
 - Israel lost their original <u>convictions</u> / forgot who God is
- Keep telling the story, keep learning, grow in <u>understanding</u>
- o We have the ability to **control** our hearts
 - Choose for yourselves this day -Joshua 24.15
 - Pray and God will <u>guard</u> your hearts and minds - Philippians 4.6-7
 - Set your <u>minds</u> on things above -Colossians 3.1-2
- Choose God; he's better at running your life than you are

Conclusion

- People lose their way sometimes
- There are things we can do to maintain a vibrant faith:
 - Have realistic <u>expectations</u>
 - o Avoid <u>temptation</u>
 - Grow in your <u>knowledge</u> and <u>understanding</u> of God
- We might find ourselves in the wilderness, but these principles will serve us well as a roadmap through the wilderness
