Introduction:

• What did Jesus' sacrifice accomplish?

Main Points: What can we say about Christ's sacrifice?

- 1. It ended the old sacrificial system vs. 1-4
 - It doesn't need to be repeated
 - Psalm 103.12; Romans 11.26-27
 - We can <u>trust</u> the promise
- 2. It <u>exercised</u> the Father's will vs. 5-10
 - This was a God decreed event
 - Psalm 40 God takes no pleasure in insincere worship
 - 1Sam. 15.22; Ps. 50.8-10; Isa. 1.10-13; Jer. 7.21-24; Hos. 6.6
 - If <u>Jesus</u> can submit...
- 3. It established eternal sanctification vs. 11-14
 - vs. 11 12 -- Note the series of contrasts...
 - Sacrifices presented daily // once for all time
 - The priests stood // Jesus sits
 - Many different sacrifices // one all consuming sacrifice
 - Never could take ways sins fully // perfects for all time those who are...
 - We can **rest** in God's <u>ability</u> rather than our own

- 4. It <u>emancipated</u> us from the rule of Law
 - The role of the Holy Spirit in sanctification
 - The Spirit testifies; The Scriptures are inspired - 2Timothy 3.16; 2Peter 1.21
 - The Spirit attests to the new covenant and the inscription of God's will upon the human heart
 - The Spirit prompts our consciences to avoid sin
 - Eye witnesses corroborate an event
 - Galatians 5.23 against such things there is no law.
 - We are <u>not on our own</u>

Conclusion:

Rest in the saving, sanctifying work of God

We are made holy by the

Efficacious nature of the sacrifice

Which was *decreed* by the Father

To perfect for all time those being **<u>sanctified</u>**

And protected by the **work** of the Holy Spirit

We will see God because we are, by the work of God, **Sanctified.**
