## The Way We Worship

John 4.7-26 August 16, 2020

## Introduction

- Setting: Samaria / Sychar
- Issues: worship and evangelism
- Items to note: the discussion of the <u>Spirit</u> / the relationship between <u>salvation</u> and worship
- The <u>contrast</u> between Nicodemus and the Samaritan woman / moving from <u>outside</u> to <u>inside</u>

Main Points: Worship is

- 1. **Living** vs. 10-15
  - Living water is water that moves like a river as opposed to well water or water from a cistern.
  - Numbers 20.11; Revelation 14.2; 19.6; Ezekiel 47
  - Worship flows from the **heart** of the true believer
- 2. **Unadulterated** vs. 16-19
  - The five husbands correlate to Israel's idolatry 2Kings 17.24-41
  - Psalm 81.8-12; Jeremiah 1.16
  - We can't worship God and <u>ourselves</u> at the same time
- 3. **Boundless** vs. 20-21
  - It doesn't matter where
  - Acts 7.48; Isaiah 66.1-2

 True worship can happen anywhere; it's the <u>person</u> we worship, not the place

## 4. **Spiritual** – vs. 22-24

- When he speaks of "worship in Spirit and truth," Jesus may have in view the common identification of the \*Spirit with prophetic inspiration and empowerment in ancient Judaism, as well as \*Old Testament passages about charismatic, prophetic worship (especially 1 Sam 10:5; 1 Chron 25:1–6). Given the common belief that the prophetic Spirit was no longer fully active, Jesus' words would strike ancient ears forcefully. The future hour (4:21) is present as well as future; Jesus makes the character of the future world available to his \*disciples in their present lives (see comment on 3:16). For oppressed Jews and Samaritans longing for the future promise, this was also a striking statement.<sup>1</sup>
- The heart of worship is worship from the heart

## Conclusion

True worship is

- o passionate living
- o <u>pure</u> to God and God alone
- personal focused on God
- o **pneumatic** it's a spiritual exercise

This is the way we worship.
