What Matters to Jesus

John 17.1-26 February 7, 2021

Introduction:

- What matters to you? What are your priorities?
- Chapter 17 is referred to, often, as the High Priestly Prayer

Explanation of the Test:

From the text we can infer that Jesus was concerned that...

- 1. He would be glorified vs. 1-5
 - glory, glorify, glorified 5x's in the first 5 verses; c.f. 1.14 --
 - We read of Jesus being glorified at the wedding at Cana in context of the disciples putting their faith in him, and again at the Transfiguration, as attested to by Peter
 - 2Peter 1.16-17
 - Jesus was concerned that the Father would glorify him; how can we glorify God?
 - celebrate Him
 - by loving Him and each other
 - honour and obey Him
 - tell others about Him
- 2. The disciples would be sanctified vs 16-19
 - to be holy means to be set apart; distinguished from the ordinary; we might even use terms like sacred and secular
 - o what is our purpose?
 - to know and love God and make God known - vs. 24-26
 - Jesus entrusted the disciples to continue his mission
 - that commission has been passed down through the ages, from generation to generation - we are still being sent
 - o revival begins with prayer

- 3. The Church would be unified vs. 20-23
 - a. Jesus prays for all that will believe
 - b. Ephesians 4.1 ff.
 - i. Psalm 133
 - c. Unity comes when we are committed to the same God, the same mission, the same heart. Then we be of the same mind, the mind of Christ.

Conclusion:

- This is the longest recorded prayer of Jesus Christ
- in it he prays for himself, his disciple, and his Church
- What matters to Jesus is that
 - he would be glorified
 - his disciples, sanctified and
 - o his Church, unified
- Jesus appeals to the Father to be glorified, and the Father did glorify the Son
- Jesus' followers can glorify God by...
 - celebrating God
 - o loving one another
 - o living lives that honour God, and by
 - responding to the commission of God faithfully.
