<ul> <li>Seeking justice –         <ul> <li>specific to the land given to them by God – related to covenant: YHWH/Israel/land</li> <li>found slain – intentional death, not an accident</li> <li>murder and bloodguilt were a major issue because it impacted Israel's ability to worship</li> <li>elders came out to represent the families of the community and judges came out to ensure fairness and partiality so that social breakdown didn't happen</li> <li>Such a murder involved the wholein blood guilt.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
