Implications of the Text

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- The nature of sin is pervasive and communal
- What we do affects others

• Adam – 2 perspectives:

Reformed (Federal) view -- According to this view,
Adam was constituted by God's sovereign appointment
the representative of the whole human race. With
Adam as their representative, God entered into
covenant, agreeing to bestow upon them eternal life
on condition of his obedience, but making the penalty
of his disobedience to be the corruption and death of
all his posterity. In accordance with the terms of this
covenant, since Adam sinned, God accounts all his
descendants as sinners, and condemns them because
of Adam's transgression.¹

 Arminian view -- According to this theory, all men, as a divinely appointed sequence of Adam's transgression, are naturally destitute of original righteousness, and are exposed to misery and death. By virtue of the infirmity propagated from Adam to all his descendants, mankind are wholly unable without divine help perfectly to obey God or to attain eternal life.²

- The Bible tells us that one day the secret sins of life are going to be brought to light at the final judgment.


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- 3. There's no such thing as an unpunished sin
