- 2. Standing up 14.13: ¹³ Therefore let us not pass judgment on one another any longer, but rather decide never to put a stumbling block or hindrance in the way of a brother.
 - a. commit to being someone that helps other people stand firm in the faith
 - i. In 1Corinthians 8.12-13
 - b. How can we become aware of potential stumbling blocks?
